

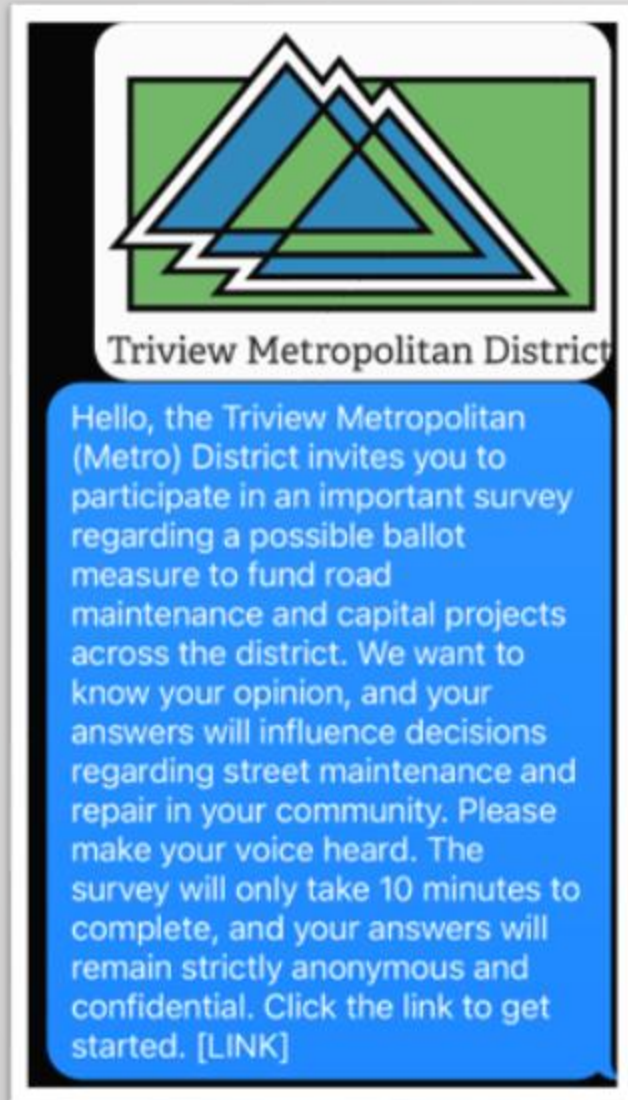


Triview Metro District Higby Road Ballot Measure Survey

December 10th – 19th, 2024



Methodology



Magellan Strategies is pleased to present the results of a survey of 387 voters in the Triview Metropolitan District in Monument, Colorado. The interviews were conducted from December 10th – 19th, 2024.

The overall survey responses have a margin of error of +/- 4.81% at the 95% confidence interval. Population subgroups will have a higher margin of error than the overall sample.

The survey results are weighted to be representative of the voter turnout demographics for a May special election within Triview Metro District.

Survey Objectives



- This survey aimed to measure voter support and opposition to a potential ballot measure to redevelop Higby Road in the Triview Metro District.
- The survey measured the job approval and image rating of the metro district providing and managing services.
- The survey tested information related to the Higby Road project to identify changes in support for the potential ballot measure.

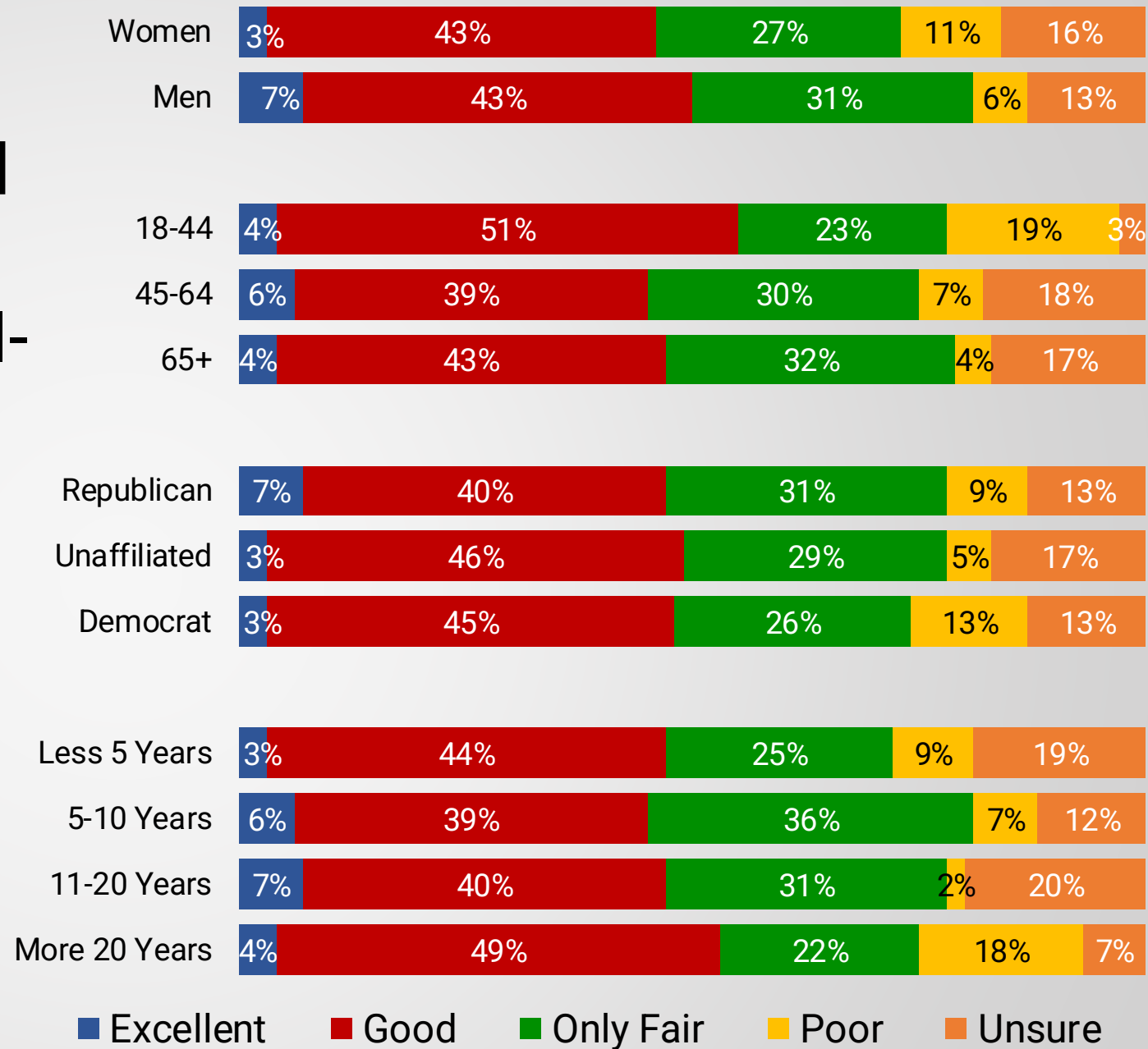
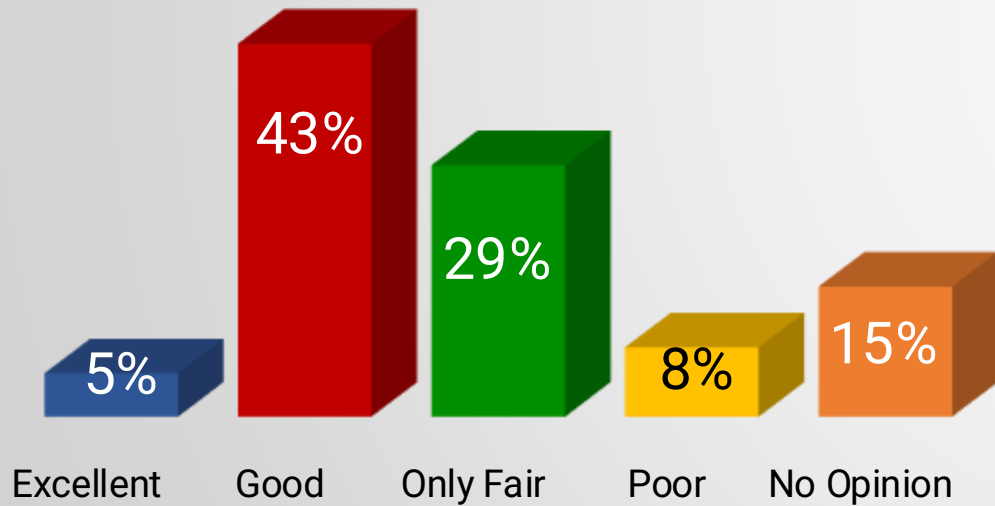

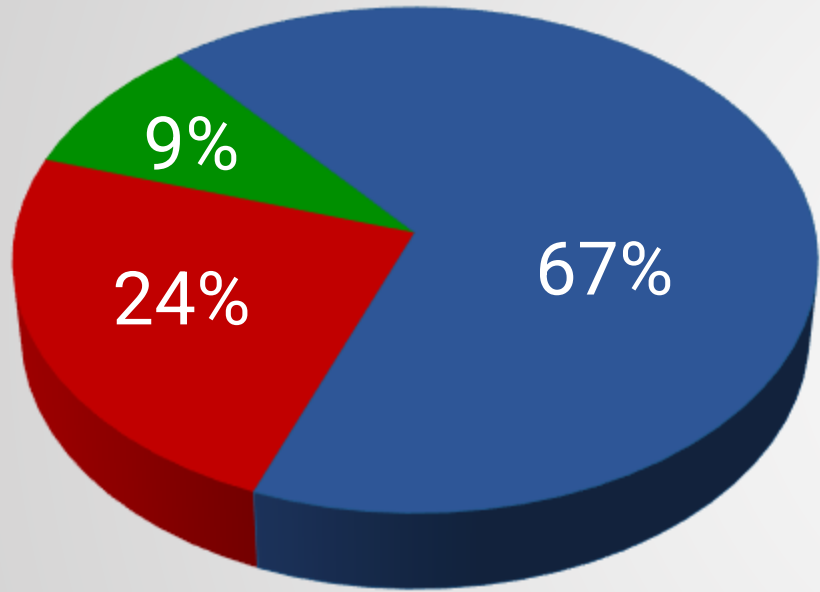

How would you rate the condition of the streets and roads in the Town of Monument located west of I-25?

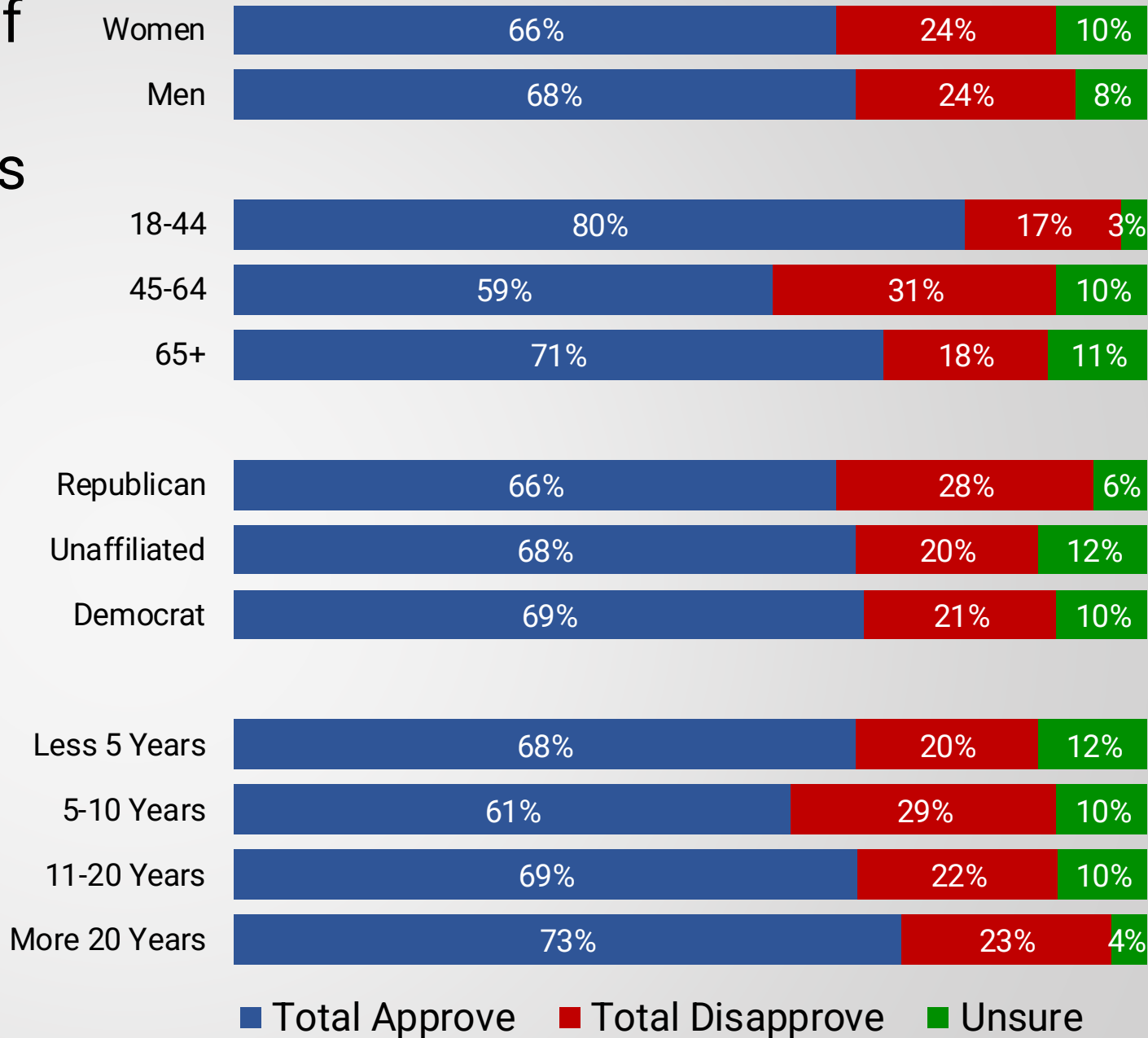


Do you approve or disapprove of the job the Town of Monument does to maintain and improve its streets and roads?

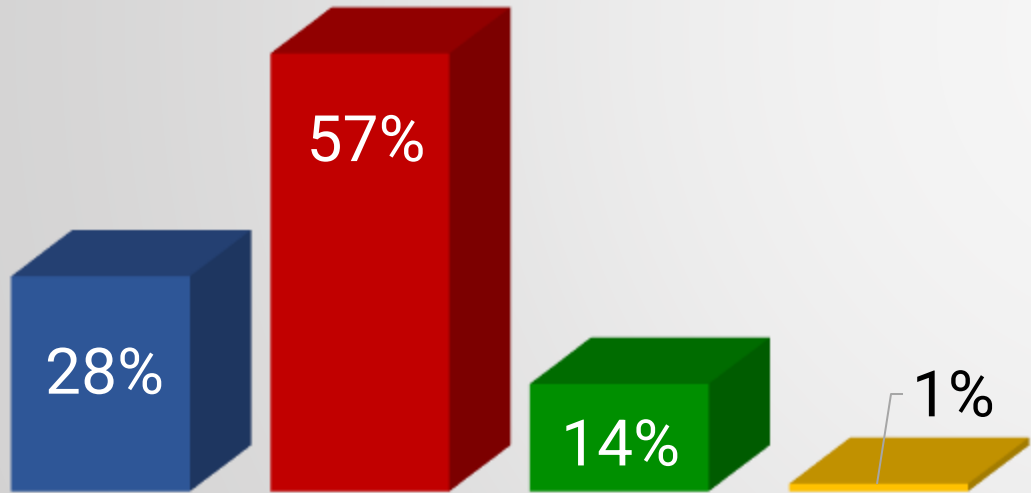

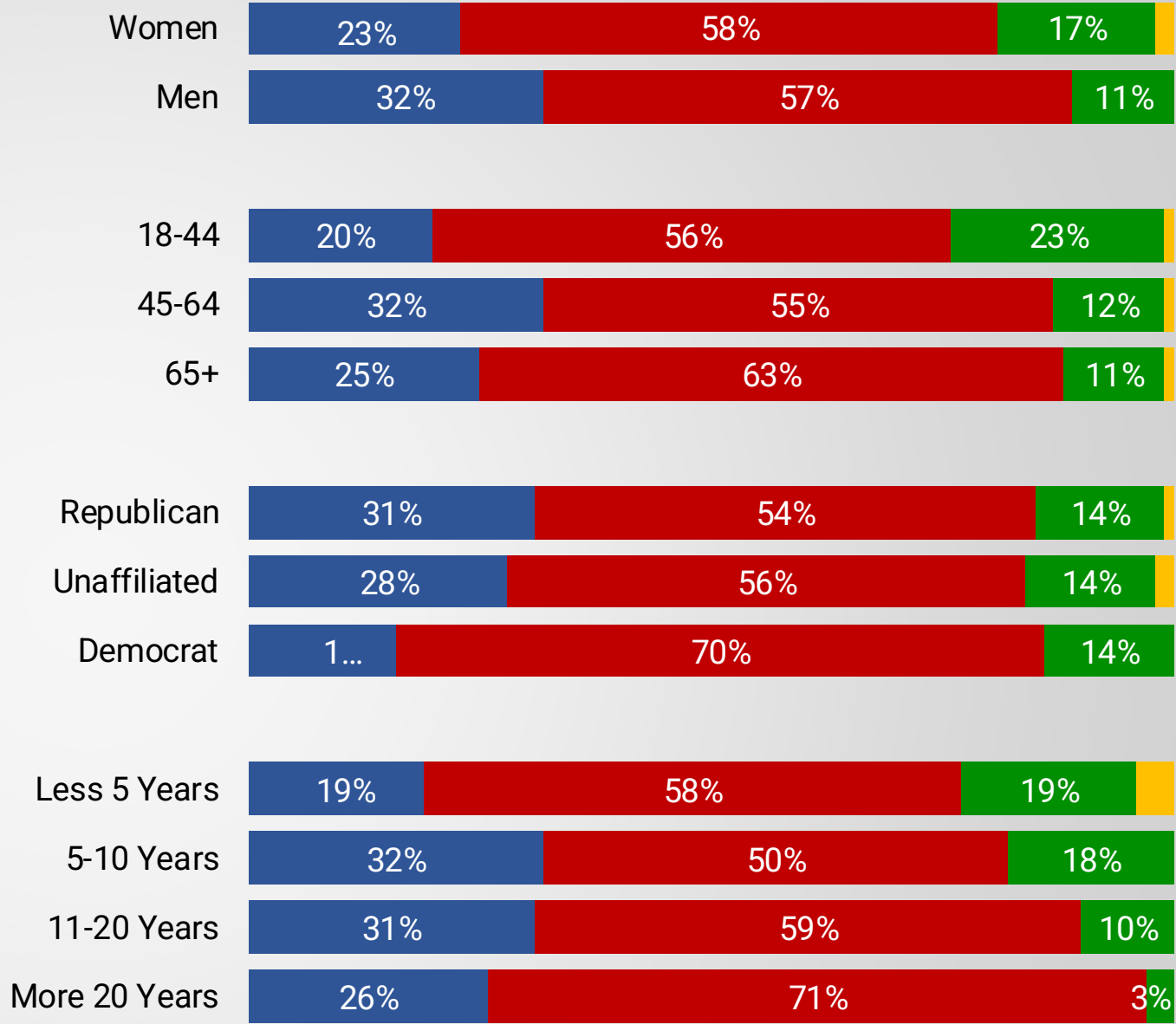

Very and Somewhat Familiar Combined 85%



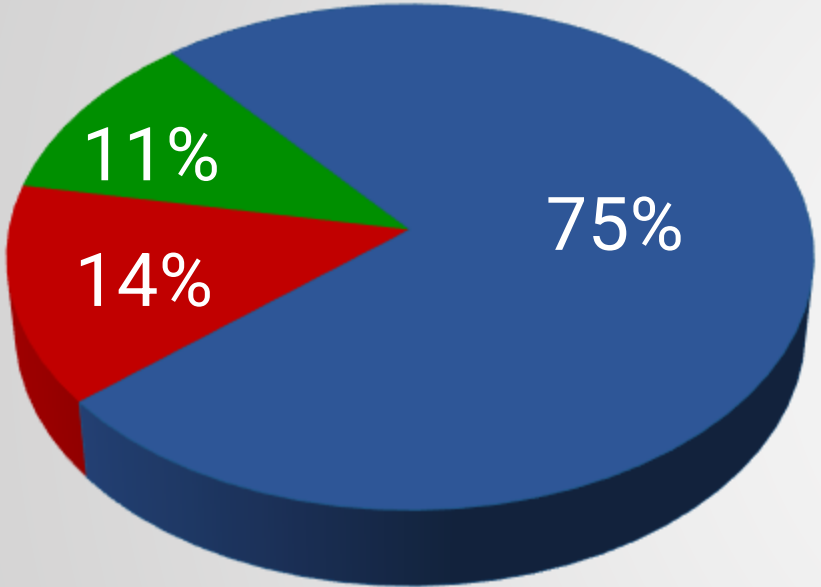
Very Familiar Somewhat Familiar Not Familiar at All Unsure or No Opinion

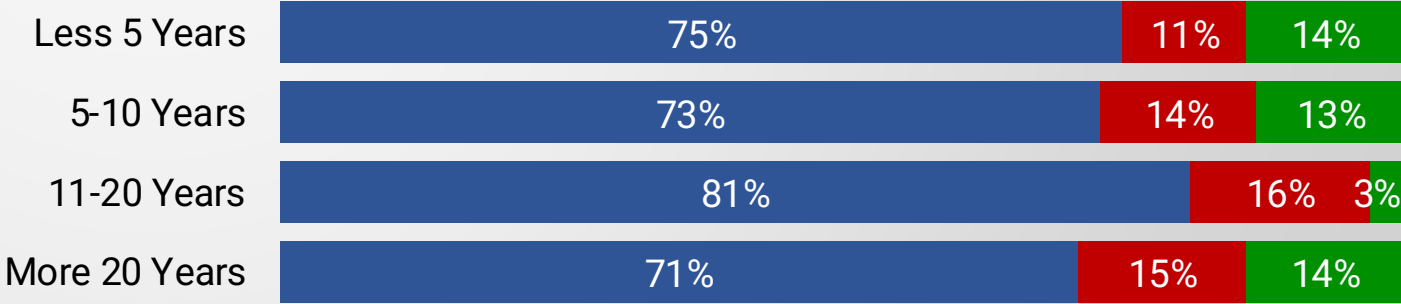
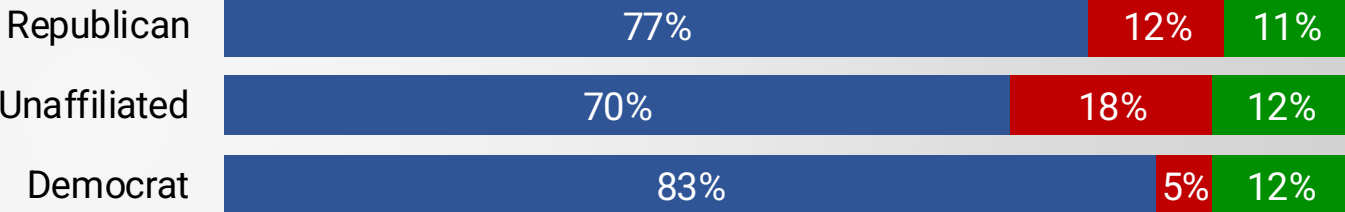
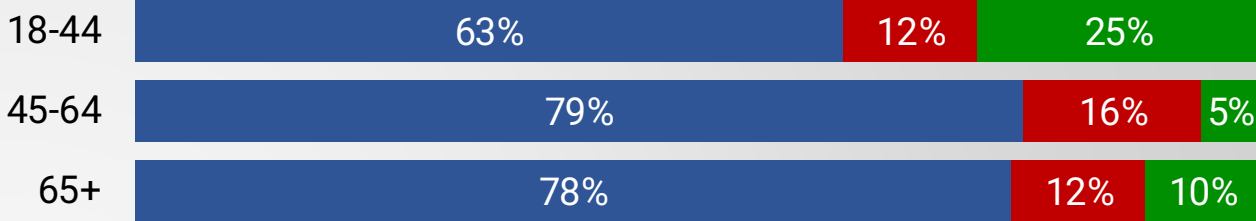
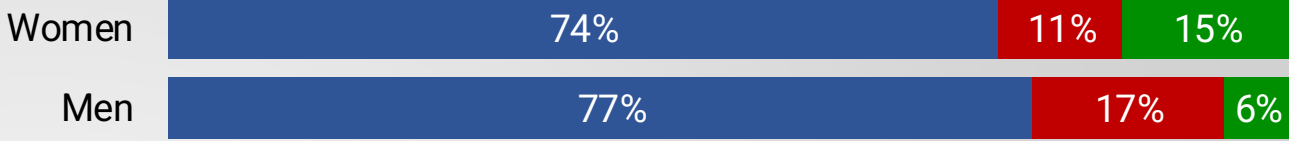


Do you have a favorable or unfavorable opinion of the Triview Metro District?

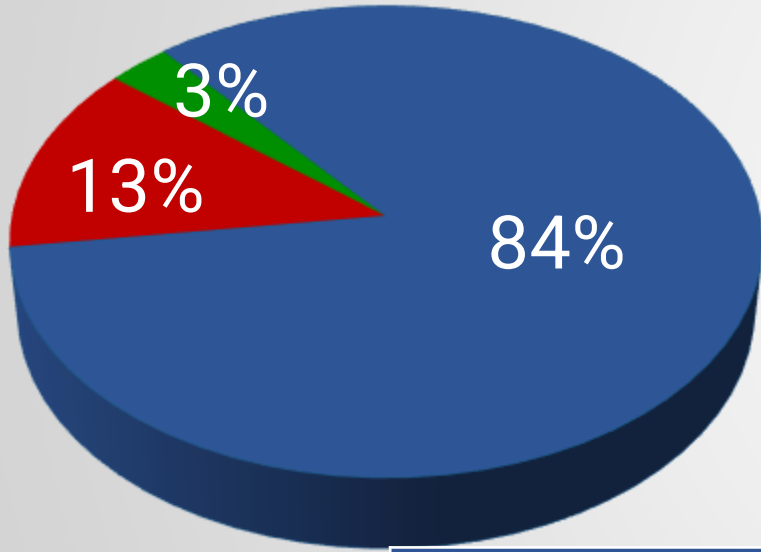

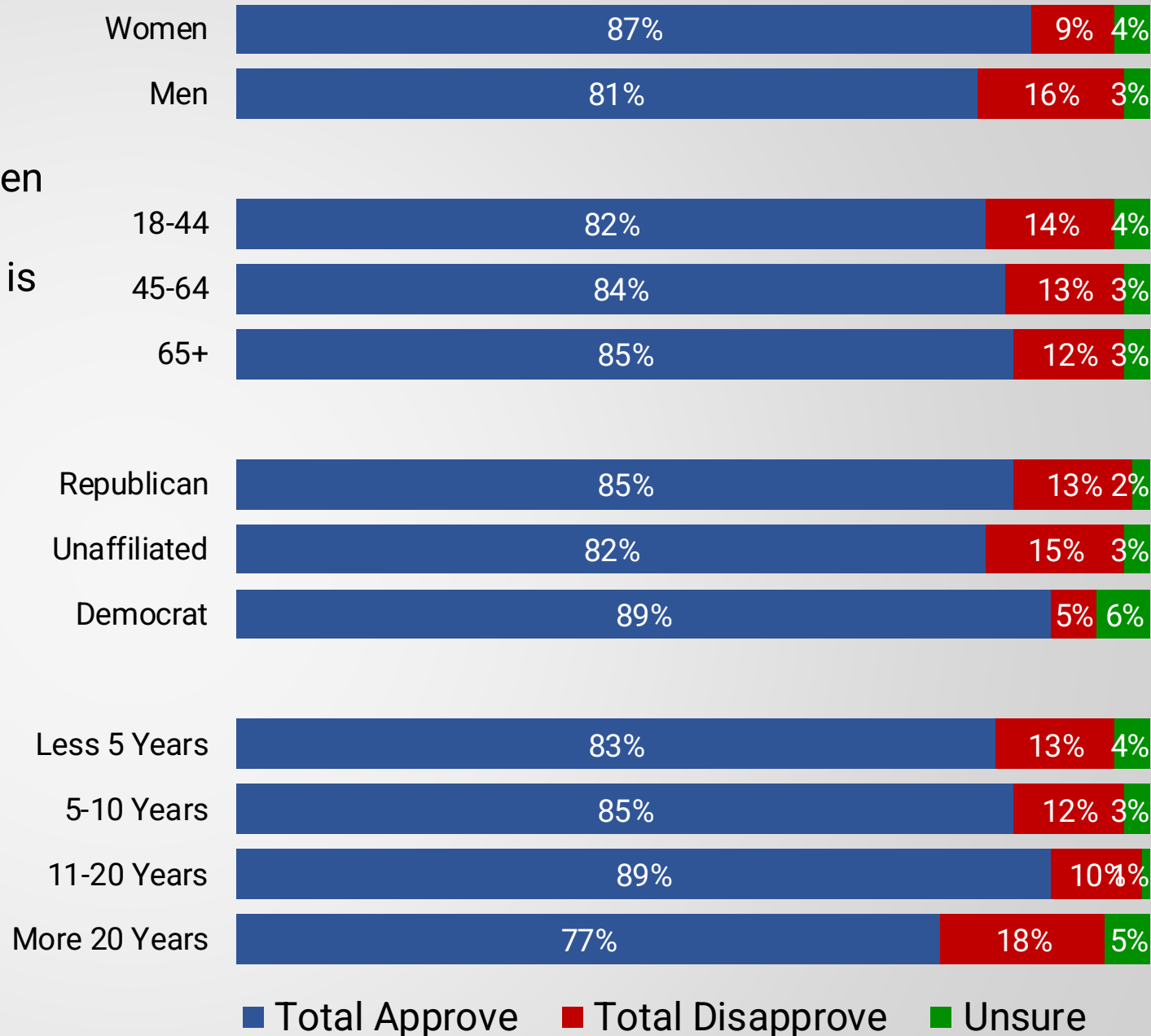

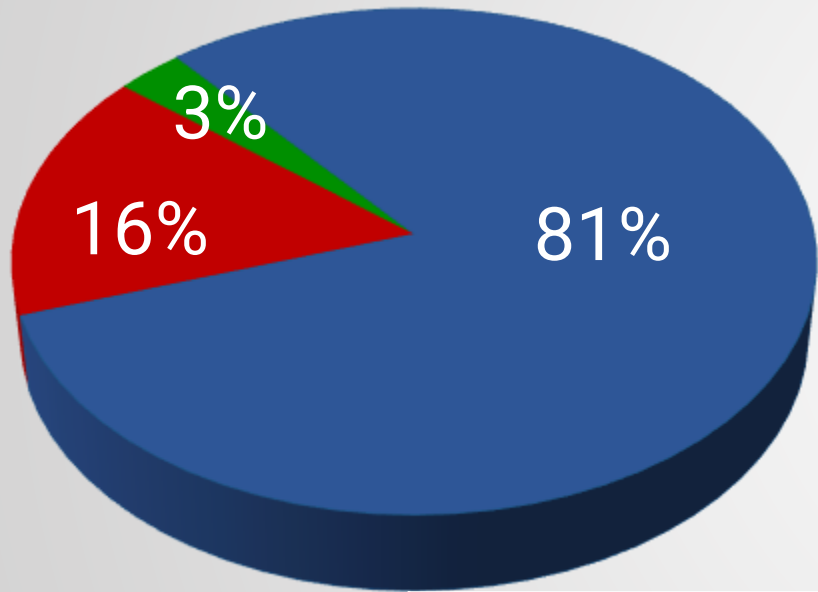

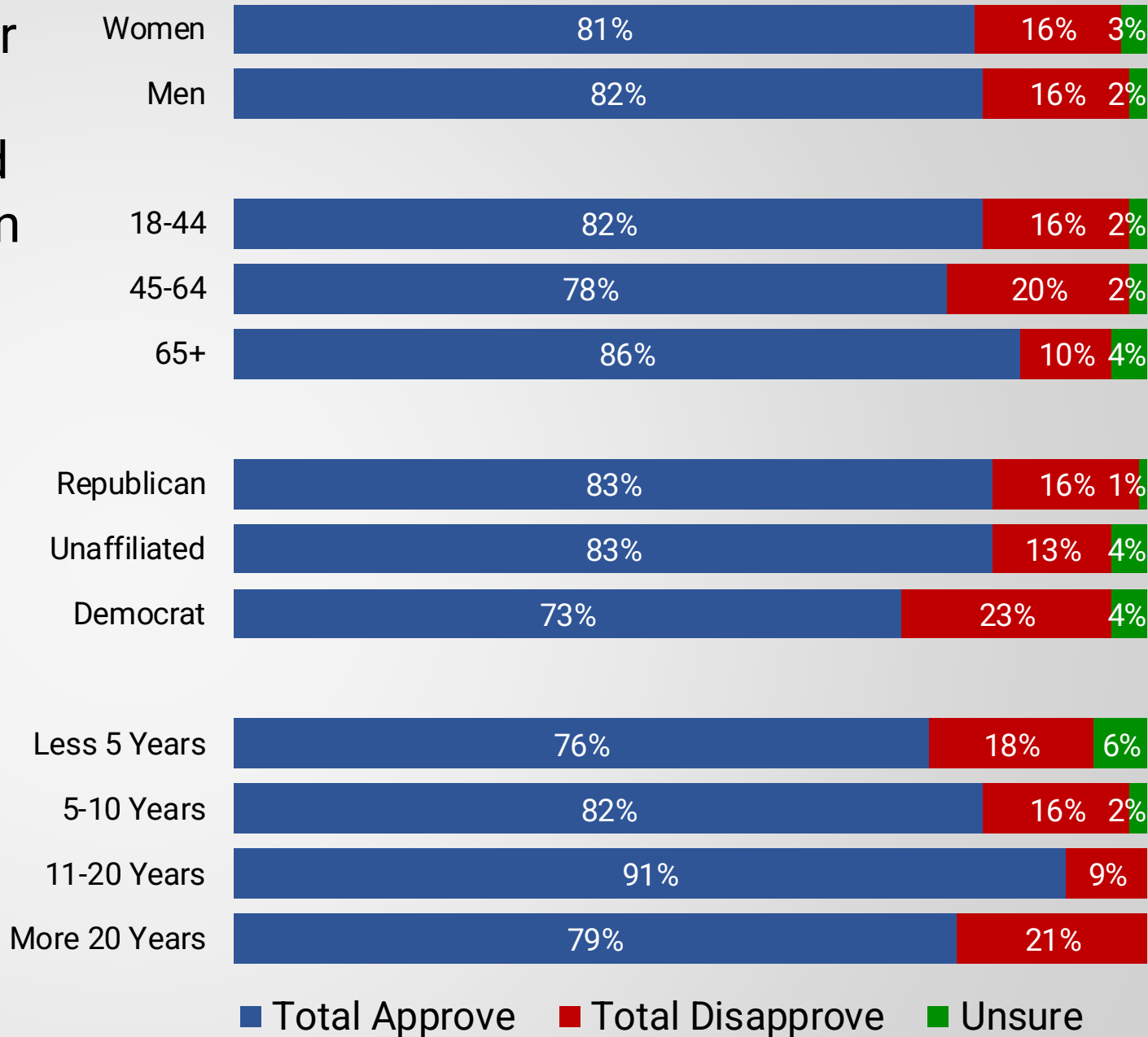


More specifically, do you approve or disapprove of the job the Triview Metro District does to maintain and improve the streets and roads within the district?

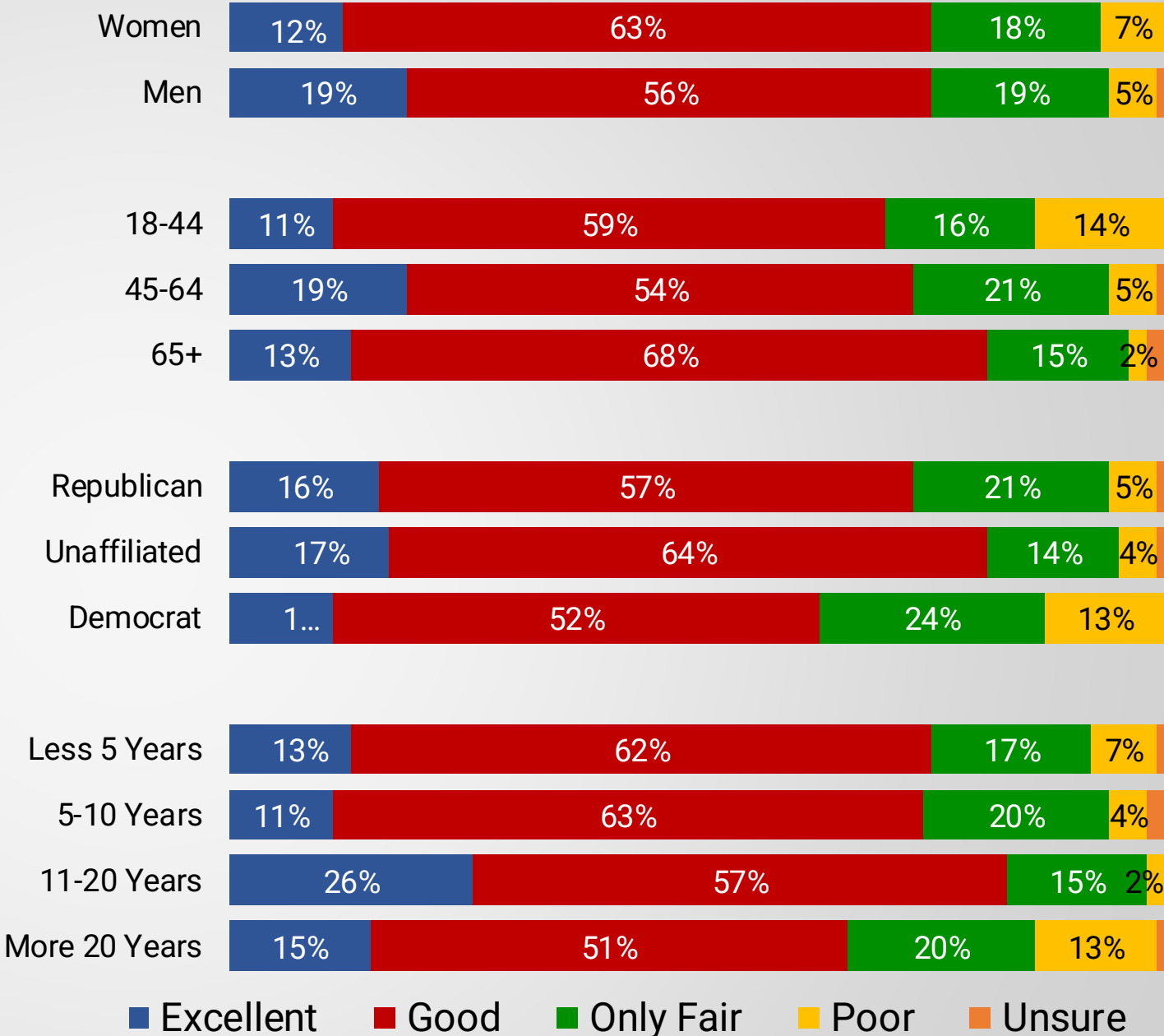
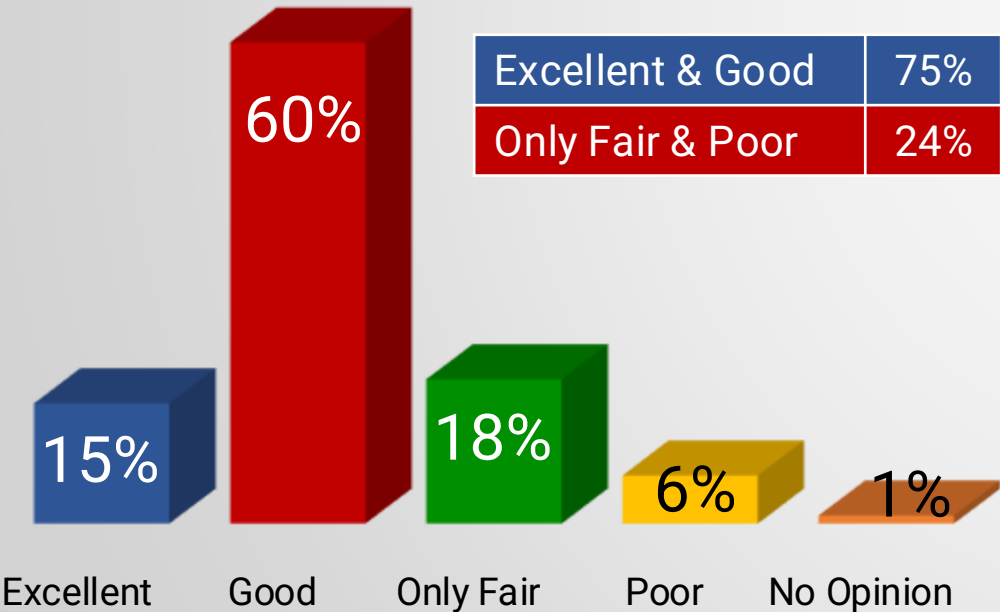

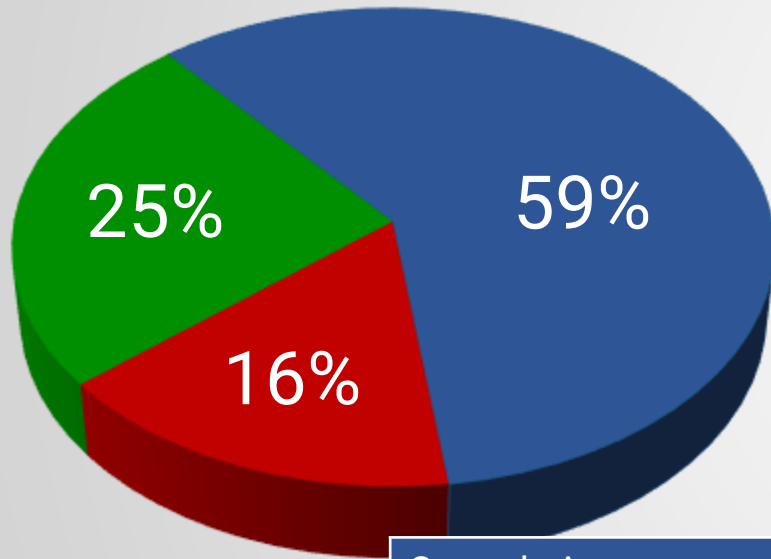

How would you rate the condition of the streets and roads in the Triview Metro District?

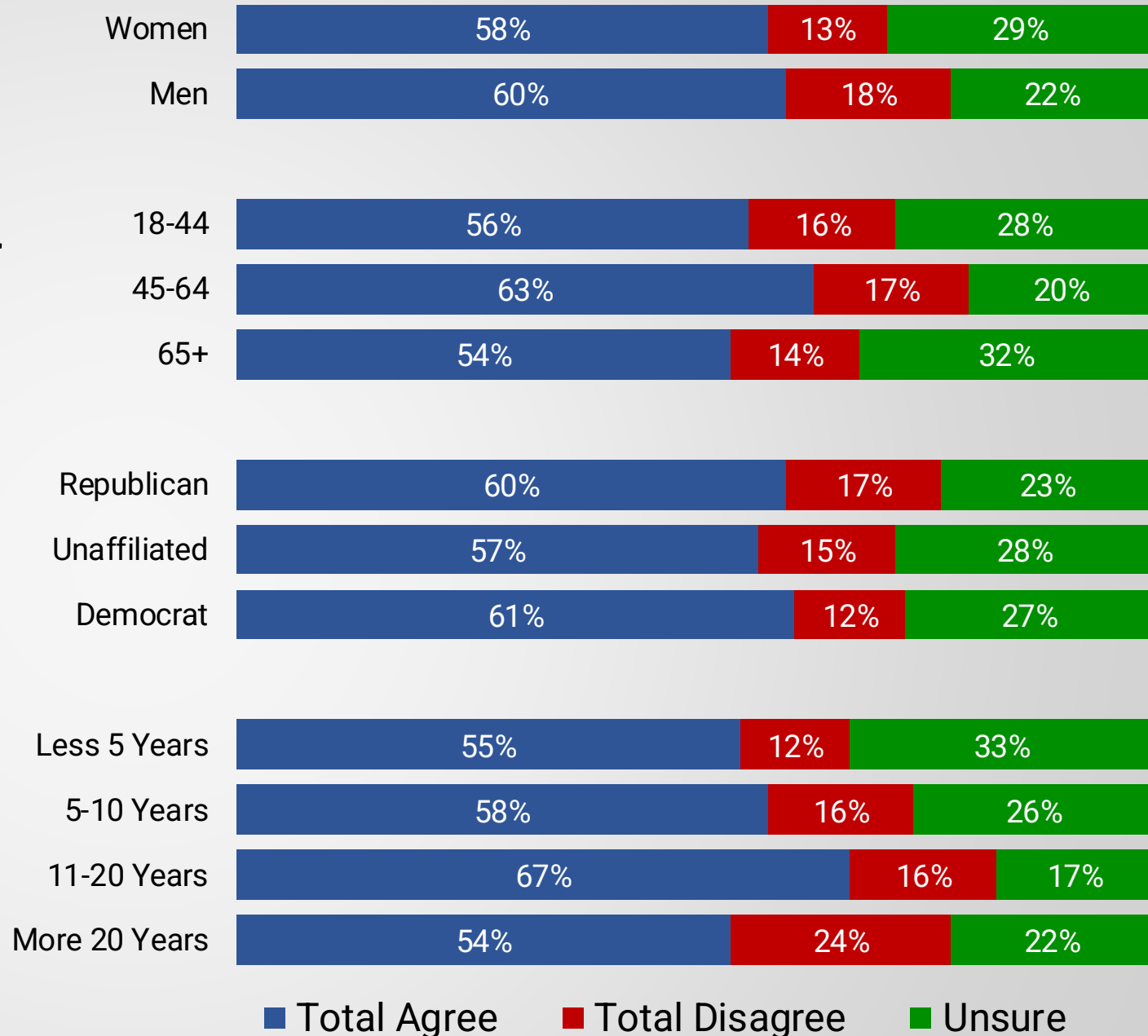


Do you agree or disagree with the following statement? *“The Triview Metro District is fiscally responsible and spends taxpayer money wisely.”*

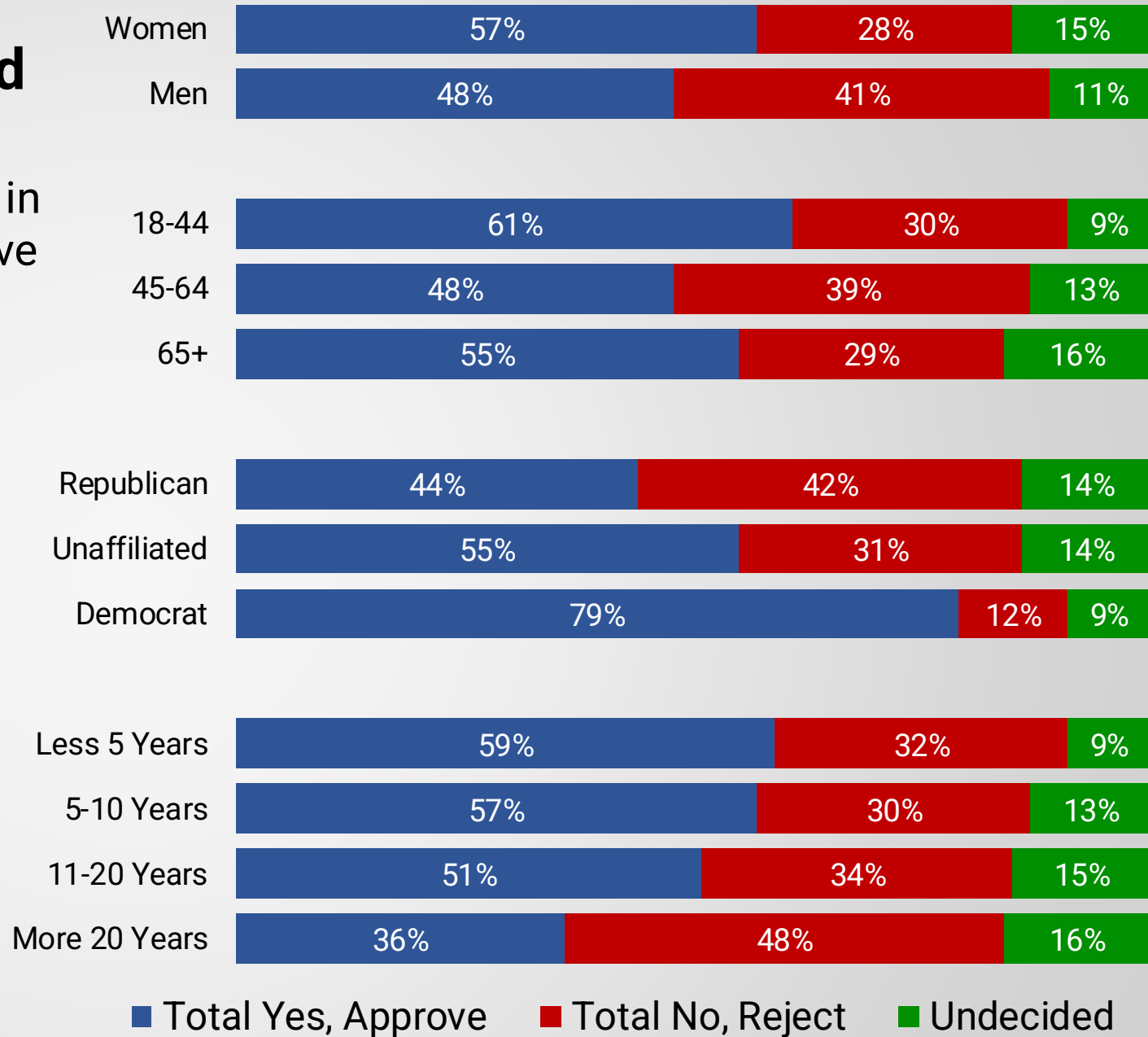

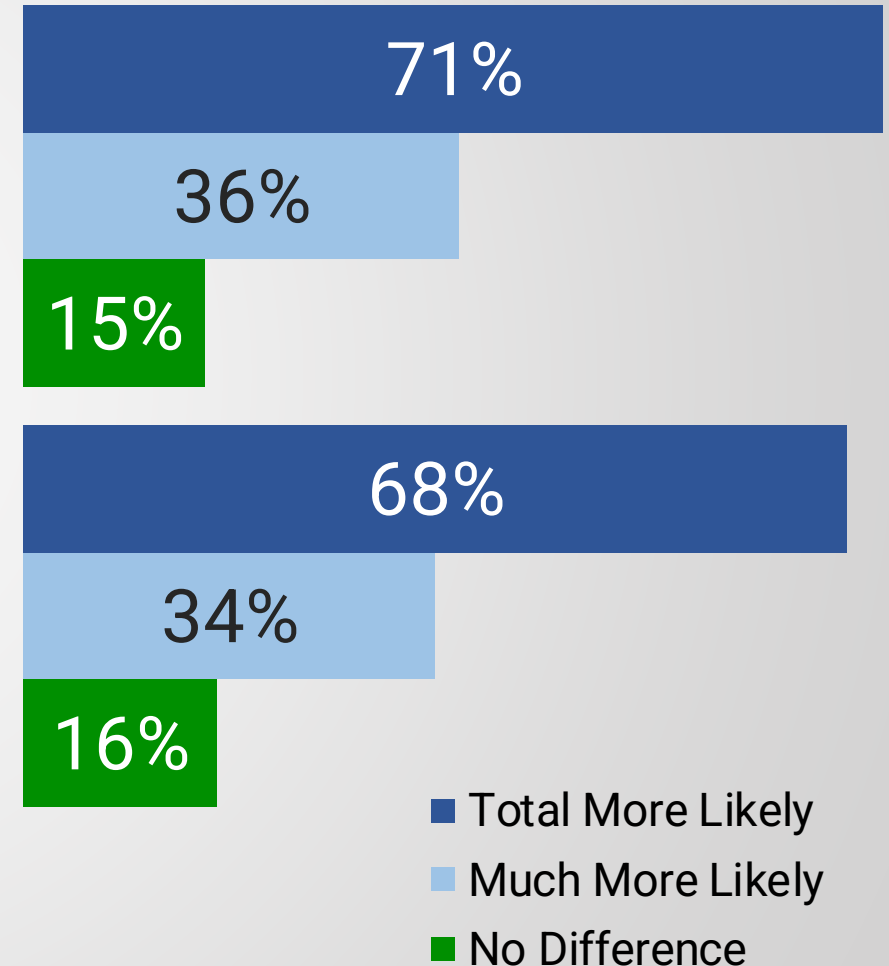

After reading the information, please indicate if you would be more likely to approve the potential ballot measure or if you would be more likely to reject it.

Triview Metro District has **lowered its property tax rate by reducing its mill levy from 35 mills to 20.5 mills over the past five years**, saving residents approximately \$2,000 over the last five years for a home valued at \$600,000. Even if the ballot question were to pass, increasing debt by \$12.6 million, Triview Metro District plans to continue to decrease its property tax rate just as it has done in the past.

Increased traffic on Higby Road has contributed to more speed and safety issues, especially near Lewis Palmer High School. Adding two roundabouts at Lewis Palmer High School, and the intersection of Higby and Bowstring would reduce the speed of vehicles and provide continuous traffic flow. Roundabouts also provide a significant safety benefit compared to traditional intersections, reducing fatal and injury crashes by approximately 80%.

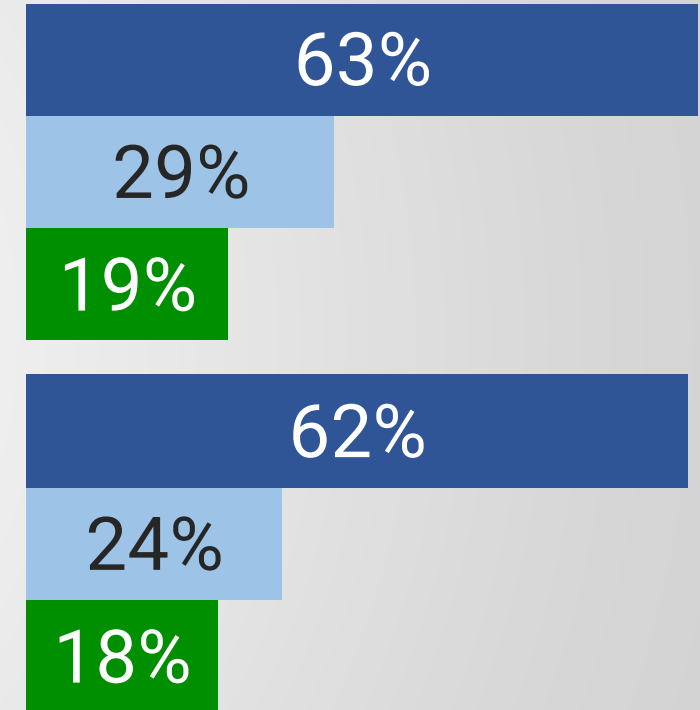

Costs for construction continue to increase annually. In 2021 Triview Metro District initially bid the redevelopment of Higby Road to cost approximately \$4 million. Today, the cost has more than tripled to \$12.6 million and will continue to increase the longer it is delayed. If the ballot question were to pass this would allow Triview Metro District to save residents money by moving forward with redeveloping Higby Road now.

El Paso County allowed the north side of Higby Road to be developed over previous years without any developer contributions to pay for the road. Now, the south side of the road is beginning to be developed, and Triview is collecting contributions from developers to help pay for the road and other infrastructure in the area before the developments are completed.

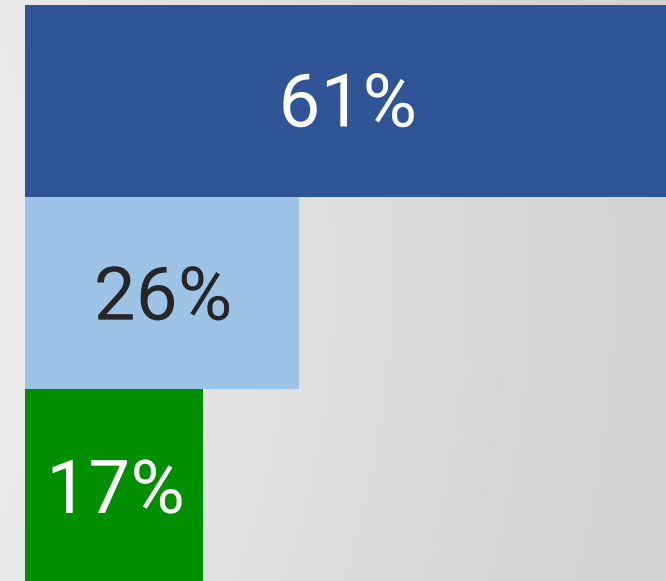

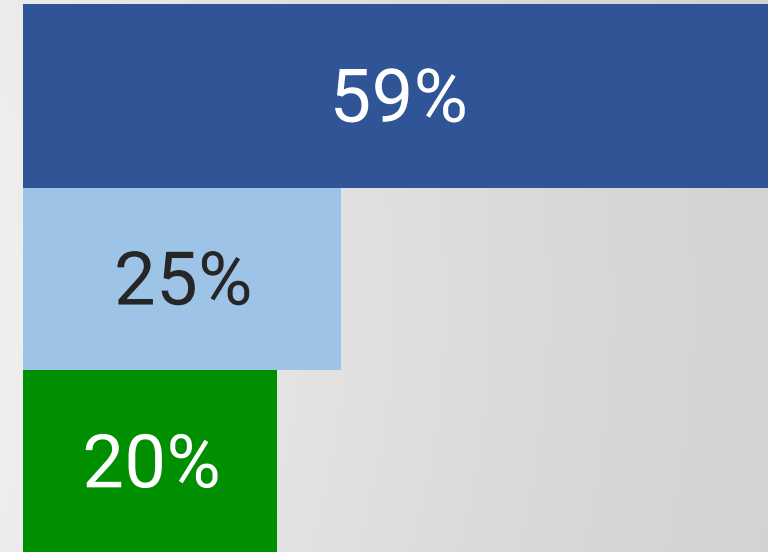
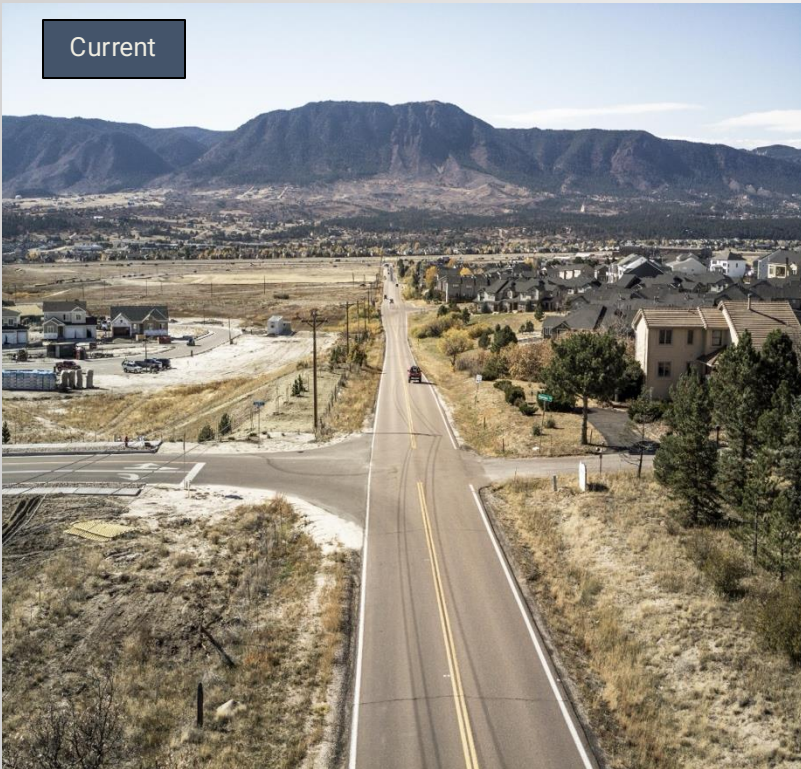

The images above show the current version of the intersection at Higby and Harness Roads. The “Proposed” image shows how Higby Road would be redeveloped at that intersection.



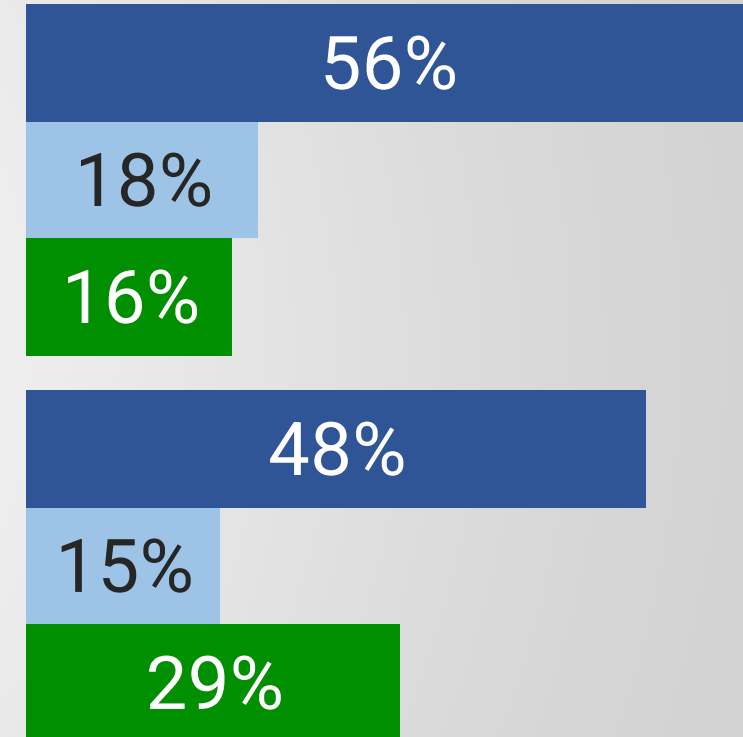

As you may know, for years the area around Higby Road was in unincorporated El Paso County. However, the road is now annexed into the Town of Monument, and due to the agreement with Triview Metro District, **Triview is now in charge of the maintenance and development of Higby Road.**

The **developers of the south side of Higby Road are asked to pay for half of the redevelopment of Higby Road. However, that will not be paid until the development is closer to being done.** If the ballot measure were to pass, Triview Metro District would move forward with rebuilding Higby Road, and then pay down the bonds once the money has been paid to the district from the developers.

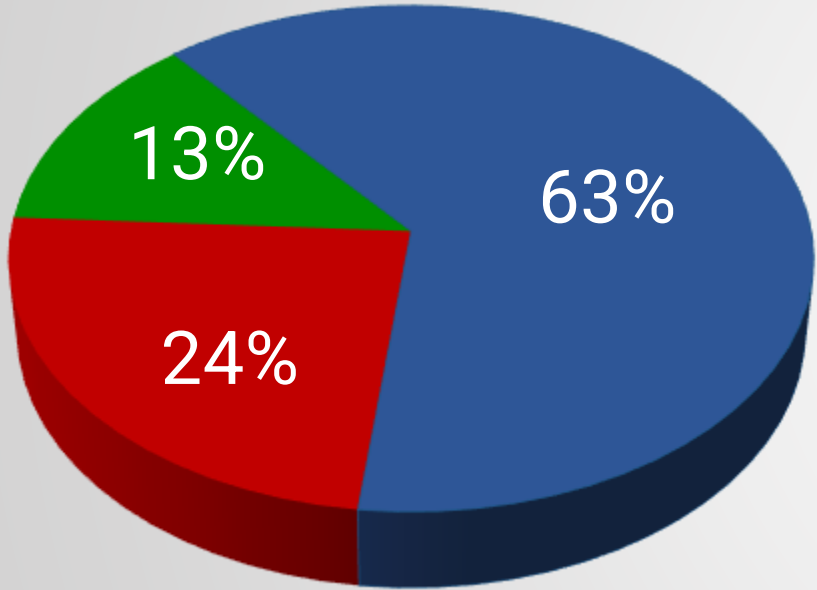

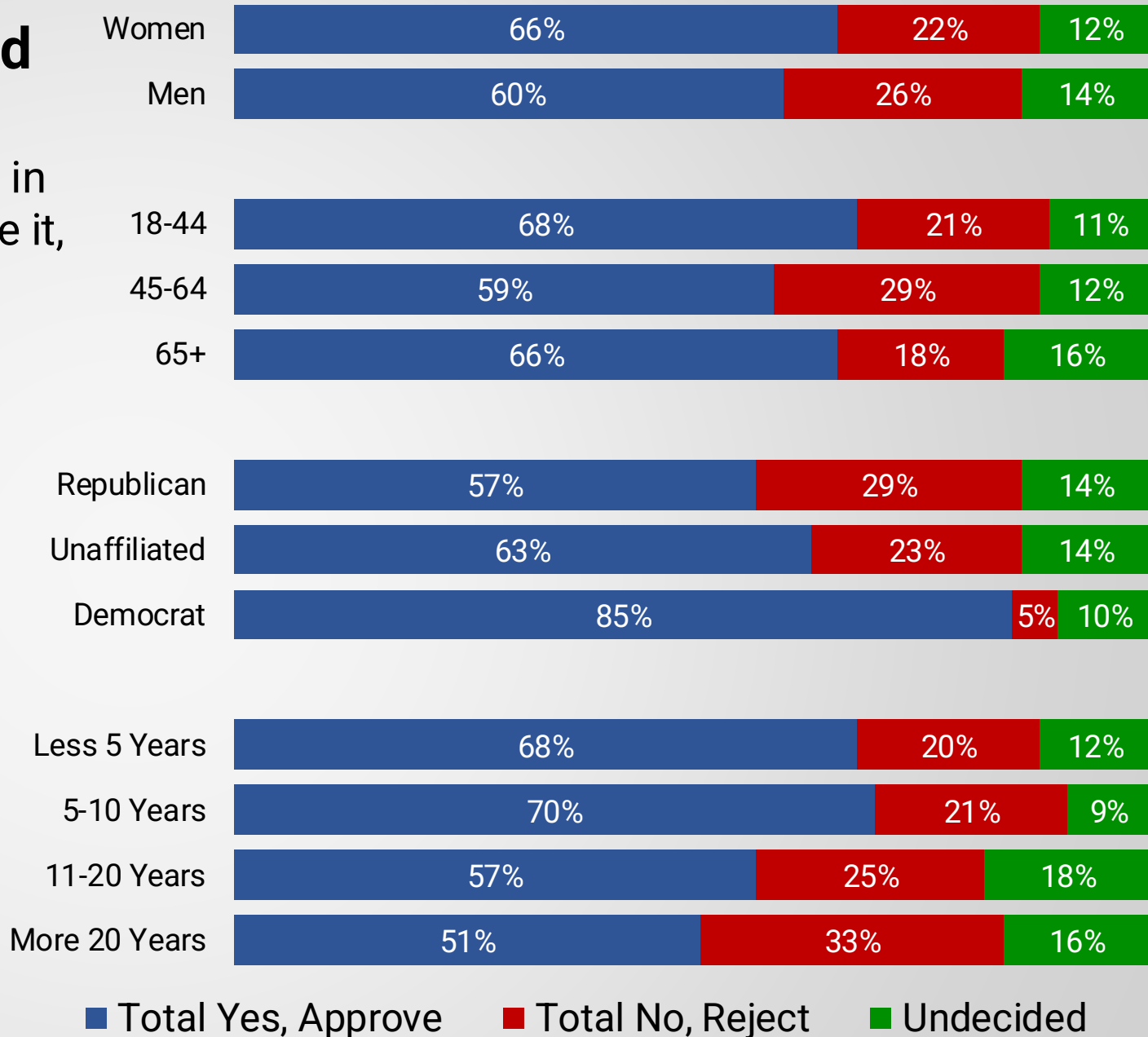

Why 63% would vote yes and approve the ballot measure to redevelop Higby Road

Please describe the reasons why you would vote yes and approve this ballot measure to redevelop Higby Road.

Safety Concerns: Many respondents cited safety as the primary reason, especially around Lewis Palmer High School, where inexperienced teenage drivers and pedestrian safety are significant concerns. Adding sidewalks, bike lanes, and roundabouts is seen as a way to improve safety for both drivers and non-drivers.

Traffic and Growth: The area's rapid growth and increased vehicle traffic necessitate better infrastructure to accommodate current and future needs. Respondents emphasized that roads should keep pace with population and housing development.

Infrastructure Improvement: Many believe the redevelopment is overdue and will improve traffic flow and congestion. Respondents highlighted the importance of addressing these issues now to avoid higher costs in the future.

Trust in Triview District: Some expressed trust in the Triview Metropolitan District for being responsible and proactive with taxpayer funds.

Developer Contribution: Respondents supported the idea of developers contributing financially to infrastructure improvements, as they are seen as contributing to the problem.

Why 24% would vote no and reject the ballot measure to redevelop Higby Road

Please describe the reasons why you would vote no and reject this ballot measure to redevelop Higby Road.

Developers' Responsibility: Many respondents believe developers should bear the full cost of the redevelopment since their projects have caused the increased need for infrastructure improvements. There is distrust that developers will pay their fair share, with concerns about developers avoiding obligations or passing costs onto taxpayers.

Opposition to Debt and Taxes: Strong concerns about taking on more debt, as some respondents believe this could lead to hidden or future tax increases. Many feel the district has already placed a significant tax burden on residents and fear this measure could exacerbate the issue. Others mentioned the rising water rates and overall cost of living in the area were cited as reasons to avoid additional financial burdens.

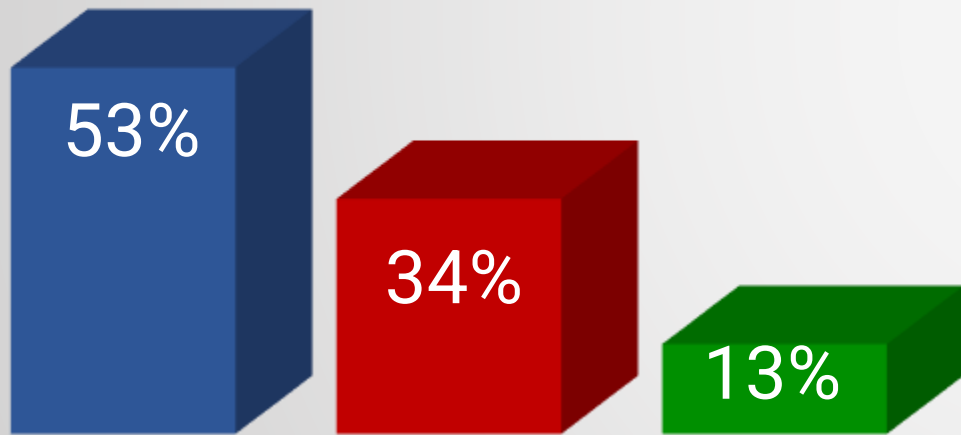
Distrust in Triview Metro District: Respondents cited examples of poor planning, mismanagement, and dissatisfaction with Triview's infrastructure projects, including complaints about existing roundabouts and road maintenance.

Opposition to Overdevelopment: Some respondents are frustrated with ongoing development in Monument, seeing it as uncontrolled and not supported by adequate infrastructure. They oppose measures that are perceived to encourage further development without proper planning.

Cost Transparency and Fairness: Concerns about unclear or misleading language in the ballot measure, making it difficult for residents to understand who will ultimately bear the costs. Some feel that only those directly benefiting from the redevelopment, such as nearby residents, should shoulder the cost.

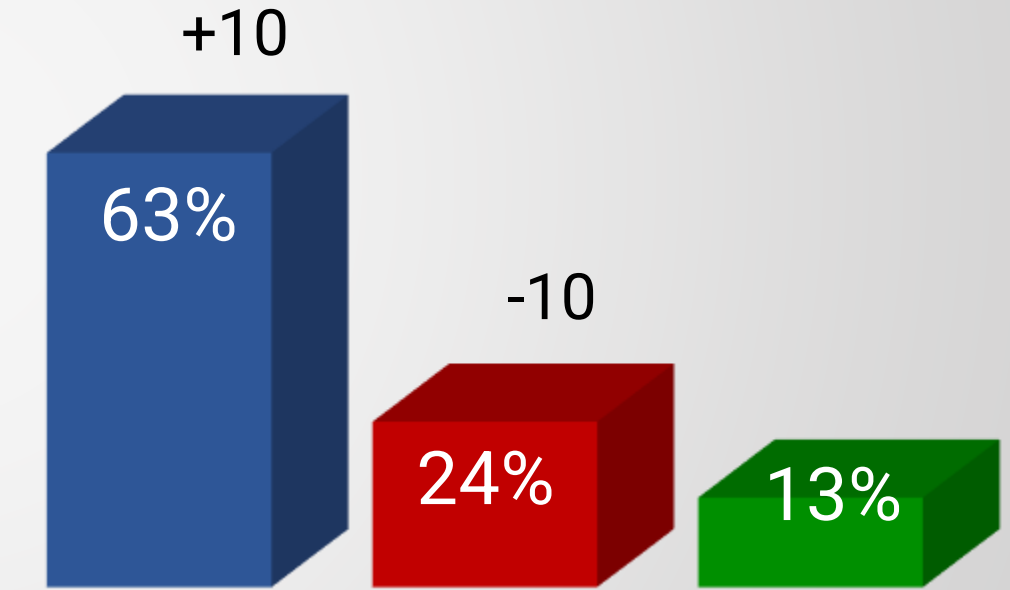

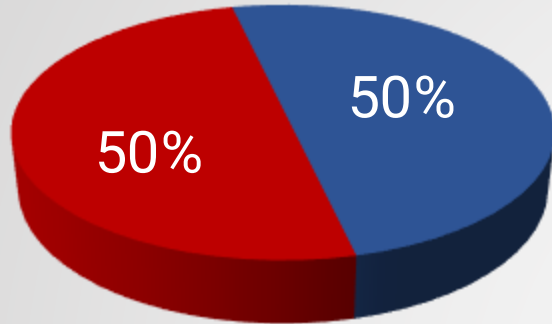

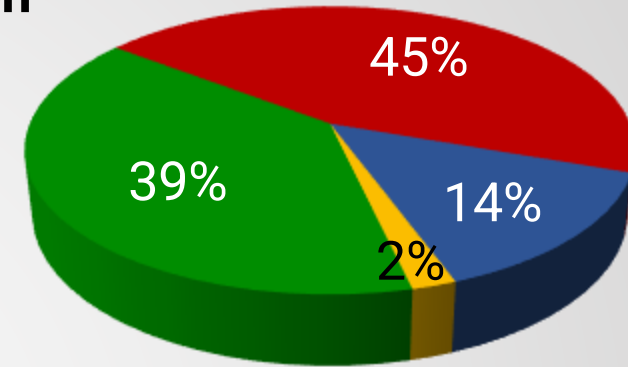

Gender



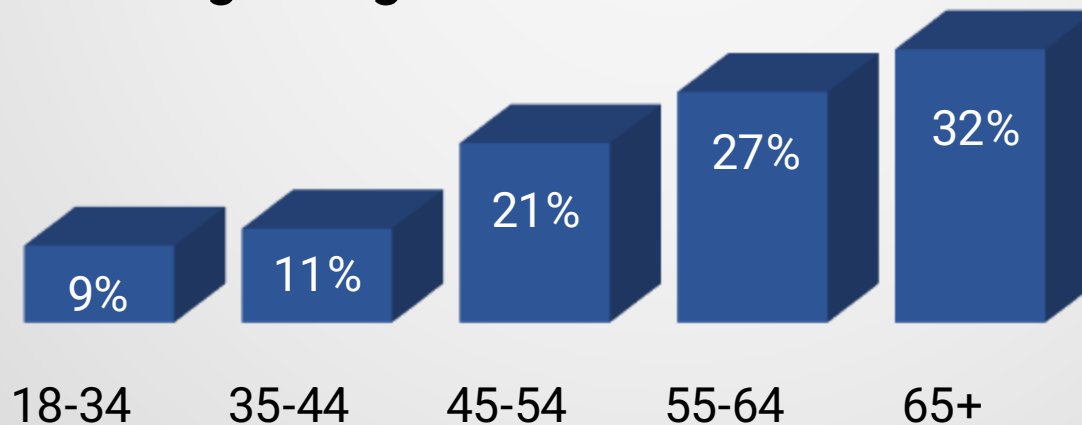

Party Affiliation



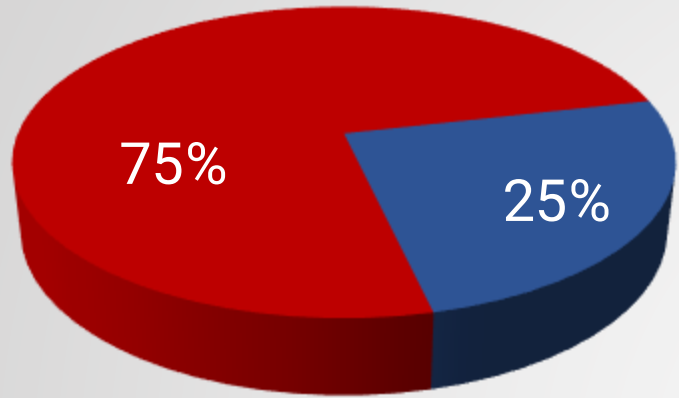

Age Range



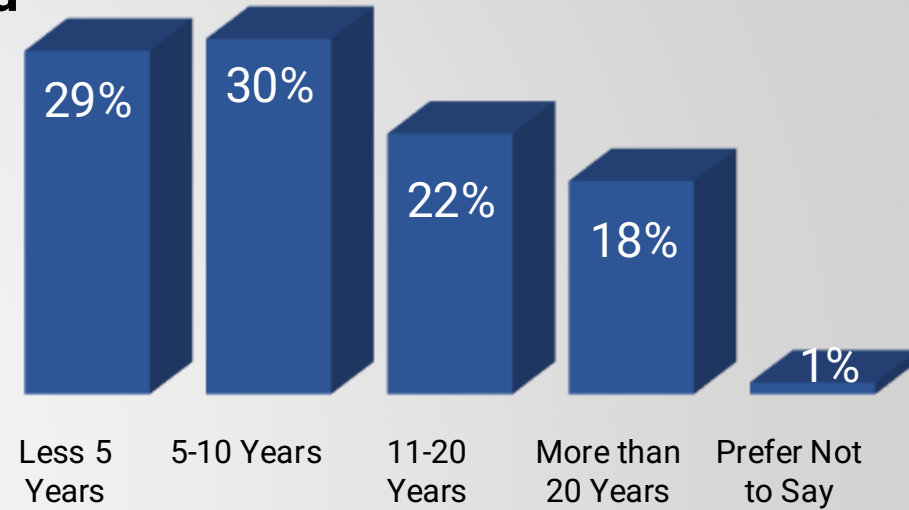

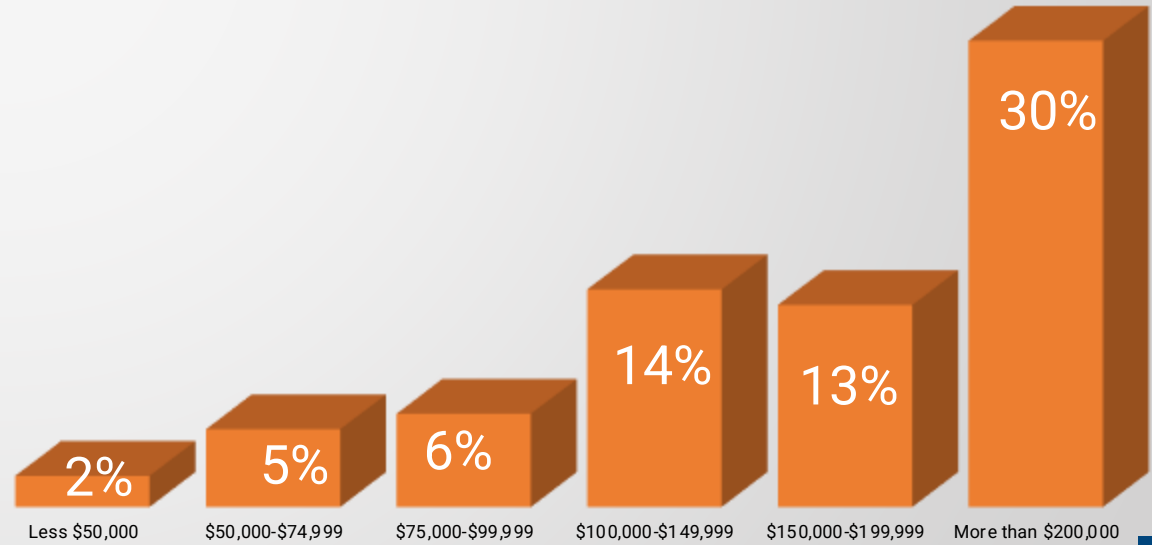

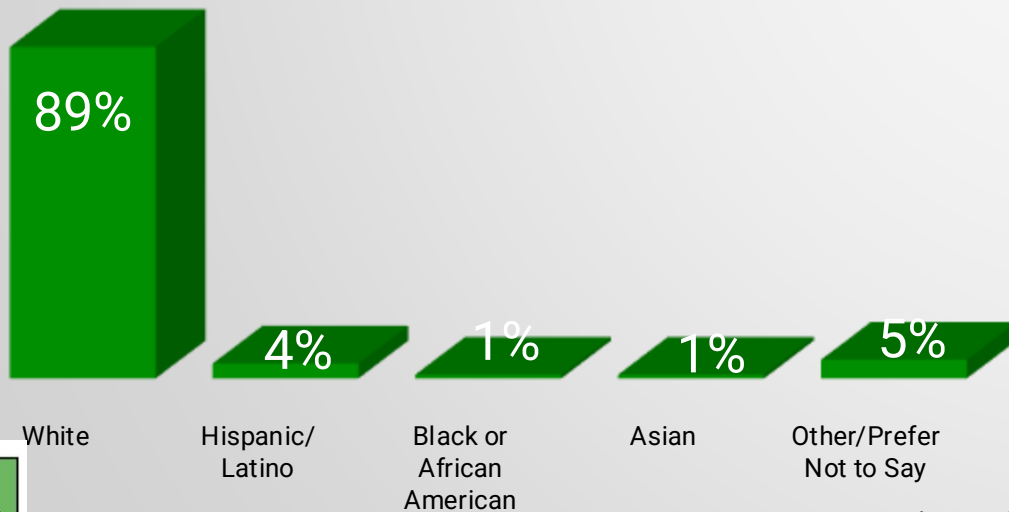
How long have you lived in the Town of Monument?
